Welcome back – Autumn 2... And what a term we have ahead!

Class 1:

Class one will be thinking about what makes a good story, the features of a narrative text and poetry this term. Our science work will continue to focus on materials and how we use them. We will be learning about homes long ago in our history work and comparing them to our own homes. RE will encourage the children to think about Advent and in art lessons we will be studying the cold weather from an artist's point of view.

Class 2:

This term Class 2 will be looking at the genres of persuasion, discussion, traditional tales and poetry in English. In science, children will be considering materials and their properties while in history the focus will be Stone Age to Iron Age. RE will allow the children to think what is meant by advent and in art, William Morris will be a source of inspiration.
