E-Safety:

Online Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE)

Whilst Cyber fraud is the fastest growing criminal activity, CSE is (and in our opinion always will be) the most disturbing. Offenders are continually looking for new ways and as always they will be in the spaces that children are in (which is why talking about those spaces is important). Live streaming is an incredibly difficult area for law enforcement to investigate and all indications are that CSE via live streaming is going to increase as the upward popularity trend of live streaming continues. Please talk to your children about this, find out the apps they are using for live streaming (commonly ones such as TikTok (formerly Musically), YouNow, Instagram Live and many others). Whilst recent research from IWF showed the majority of victims are under 13 (98%), we cannot be complacent, it could be happening to older children. A good way of engaging with the older children in something like this is to instil a sense of moral responsibility for their younger brothers/sisters and the younger pupils in school, in other words you're not telling them, you're giving them the information to be on the lookout for with younger children. The children at both Frithville and New York are very, very good at looking after children younger than themselves.
