**Triton Knoll Information:**

**Construction activity – Triton Knoll Electrical System**

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to update you about work to construct the onshore cable route for the Triton Knoll Offshore Wind Farm.

We will shortly begin excavating our onshore cable trenches along the project's cable route, and burying plastic cable ducts, which the onshore electrical cables will be pulled into and protected by. This work will be taking place between the landfall location north of Anderby Creek, where the onshore and offshore cables connect, to the River Witham near Langrick Bridge.

To ensure we capitalise on the better weather conditions and increased daylight hours during spring and summer, from April to September 2019 we are planning to increase our working hours to Monday to Saturday 7am – 7pm. We will also begin working on one Sunday every two weeks from 7am – 7pm.

During this period, we will help to mitigate the impact of our construction work by programming our weekend work to avoid residential properties where possible, and keeping our weekend vehicle movements to a minimum.

This change to our working hours has been agreed with East Lindsey District Council. Although you may see members of our workforce more frequently over the coming months, increasing our working hours will help us finish our construction activity ahead of schedule and reduce the impacts of the project longer term.

Triton Knoll is an 860MW offshore wind farm being constructed 32km off the coast of Lincolnshire. Once fully operational, it will be capable of supplying the equivalent of 800,000 typical UK households with renewable electricity every year. First energy generation could be as early as 2021, with the project expected to be fully operational in 2022.

Triton Knoll has appointed J Murphy & Sons Limited (Murphy) to carry out the onshore cable route construction. Murphy is working closely with Triton Knoll and other project lead contractors to ensure all construction activities are carefully planned to avoid disruption, and we will make every effort to minimise local impacts.

I am aware that our work may affect you and I would like to thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation.
