### Remembrance Sunday/Armistice Day:

Armistice Day is on 11 November and is also known as Remembrance Day. It marks the day World War One ended, at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month, in 1918. Several of our children will be attending Remembrance Church Parades on Sunday. This year we have again been making poppies for our corridor display and we will be having a 2 minutes silence at 11am on Monday, we will be using the school bell in my office to start and finish the memorial. Monday will be the final day to donate to the Poppy Appeal, helping us shine a light on the invaluable contributions being made by the Armed Forces community past and present.

### PE Kits:

All children must have their PE kits in school every day please, this does include a change of footwear... Please also remember swimming kits on Wednesday, we had four children without swimming kits this week - Thank you.
