What's on...

### Class 1:

This term Class One will be thinking about and using the features of non-fiction writing. We will be writing reports on bubbles in English lessons and hedgehogs in science lessons. We will then spend time reading folk tales from other cultures. Our science work on humans and animals will continue. Our history work will involve comparing the lives of Queen Elizabeth I and Queen Elizabeth II. We will be thinking about how and why Christians celebrate Easter. Maths lessons will focus on multiplication, division, addition and subtraction.

### Class 2:

This half-term Class 2 will be learning various aspects of grammar and punctuation that they will then apply to long writing tasks linked to a narrative and a discussion text. In science, the children will finish their study of various life cycles and move on to the topic of Earth and space. History will focus on the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons whilst geography will consider areas of land within the UK and the related human and physical features.
