Together with our Golden Rules, this week in assembly I've spoken about the South African word **Ubuntu**, which during this time of uncertainty in our lives helps us to stop and think. The word **Ubuntu** has several definitions, however one meaning of Ubuntu is correct behaviour, but correct in this sense is defined by a person's relations with other people. **Ubuntu** refers to behaving well towards others, or acting in ways that benefit the community. Such acts could be as simple as helping a stranger in need, or much more complex ways of relating with others. A person who behaves in these ways has **Ubuntu**. He or she is a full person. **Ubuntu** in this sense, is a way of thinking about what it means to be human, and how we, as humans, should behave towards others. ***This term we will...***

***Class 1:***

This half term in English we will be focusing on stories with familiar settings and writing recounts. In maths we be looking at place value. For science the children will be investigating materials, their properties and how we use them. In History we'll be looking at how the Great Fire of London started and the effect it had. Class 1 will thinking about how the Bible teaches to behave in RE.

***Class 2:***

This half term in science Class 2 will be looking at the circulatory system, nutrition and digestion. Geography will focus on the use of land, whilst in RE, we will consider symbolism in Christian churches. In English the children will begin to learn, or review elements of grammar and punctuation, before applying these to a narrative text.


#### "TikTok Family Pairing"

- Restricted mode - similar to YouTube restricted that tries to prevent certain content from being seen.
- Screen time management - how long children can spend in the app each day.
- Direct messages - restricting who can send the child direct (private) messages, or turn DM's off altogether.
