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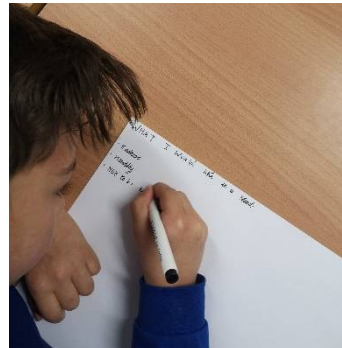
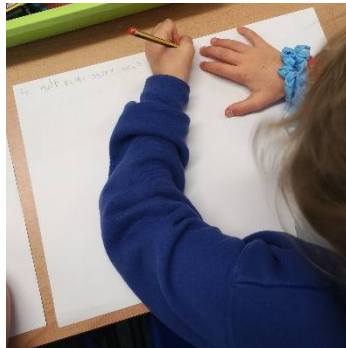


Dear Parents and Carers,

# Helping children with maths at home:

The problem with maths... Is there a problem with maths?

Nationwide teachers worry that progress in maths is more difficult to achieve than reading and writing, it is certainly a major topic of conversation within our local collaboration of schools and teachers around the country... Why?

It is strange, because unlike reading and writing we use the same maths language all around the world, the rules, skills, concepts and vocabulary are universal,  $2 + 5 = 7$  and  $2 \times 3 = 6$  everywhere. As adults, we often hear the phrase, "I was never any good at maths at school". How often do we hear the same said of reading? Maths is a life skill that we use every day in our adult lives, so the learning opportunities we provide in school have to be relevant and real, but without diluting the importance of the mathematics to be learned. Practising maths at home is just as important as reading... We use maths in our everyday lives, probably without even realising it.
